A.;The Circumflex, which consists of the two former Accents, is occasionally set on the Vowels, a, e, i, o, u, to point out that such Letters are to be pronounced long; as in matin, a mastiff-dog; tempete, a tempest; gite, a lodging; cote, a side; flute, a flue; whereas they are short in matin, morning; trompette, a trumpet, c.
