Brand New Book ***** Print on Demand *****.The Senate Finance Committee, which is expected to mark up a bill to reauthorize TANF in May, received proposals for new TANF rules in early April. They include requirements for financial education of recipients (S. 813) and new due process and data collection rules (S. 770). Pending in Committee are four comprehensive reauthorization bills: H.R. 4, the House Republican leadership bill, passed by the House February 13, S. 5, the Senate Republican leadership bill, and two Democratic alternatives, S. 367, and S. 448. H.R. 4 is almost identical to the bill passed by the House last year (H.R. 4737). Both H.R. 4 and S. 5 set the work week for most TANF recipients at 40 hours and require that states eventually engage 70 of recipients in a work activity. S. 5 adds new anti-fraud rules, and permits states to contract out the determination of food stamp eligibility. Since the original program expired October 1, 2002, TANF and related programs of mandatory child care, transitional medicaid, and abstinence education have been operating under temporary spending authority. P.L. 108-7 extended...
